PROBLEM #1 Postpartum examination.

SUBJECTIVE

Product of a normal spontaneous vaginal delivery. No maternal prenatal care. Nuchal cord at delivery. Four plus meconium present at delivery. Three cord vessels present.

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OBJECTIVE

Normal male infant. Apgar scores: 7 at five minutes and 9 at ten minutes. No respiratory distress. Lungs clear to auscultation and percussion. Two drops aqueous silver nitrate instilled OD and OS. Oropharyngeal aspiration with #7 French red rubber tube.

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ASSESSMENT

Normal male infant with no clinical evidence of meconium aspiration at present.

PLAN

Chest film to rule out pneumonitis.
